

East District Open Championships

The weekend of Saturday 6th and Sunday 7th of June saw the Commonwealth pool host it's last ever competition in its current state. The East district Long Course championships saw three of the young Dunedin swimmers take to the Old Commonwealth Pool for the final time. The Saturday morning saw Caitlin Hamilton swim in the 200m Breaststroke swimming a 3second PB and claiming the silver medal in the 11 year old age group. The afternoon saw Caitlin take to the pool again in both the open 50 fc and 200 IM both swims saw Caitlin swim just outside her PB set the previous week. The 200 IM swim saw Caitlin win gold in her age group. The 200 IM saw team mate Emily Barker also compete swimming a new 1 second personal best time in the process.

The Sunday morning saw Emily and Caitlin in the pool again with both girls swimming just outside their times. The afternoon saw the final swimmer Kenneth Drummond compete in the boys 200 Back swimming just outside his PB. The final Dunedin swimmer to compete was Caitlin in the 200 FC where she swam a 7 second PB to take the gold medal for 11 year old girls just narrowly missing out on her British qualifying time.
